This Week's Action Step

Spend 10 minutes each weekday in a place of solitude. Read a Bible passage. Be still in God's presence. Pray using the Lord's Prayer to guide you. This week, add a layer: journal your thoughts and prayers.

MONDAY

1. If you could wake up tomorrow to a new day free from any past issues or problems, a day cast in your own making, what would it look like?
2. What do you think God wants in this world? In your life?

Read: Luke 3:1-22

TUESDAY

1. Israel looked forward to a day of the Lord, a day when God would return to set things right. On Sunday Pastor Dave listed some aspects of what that day, or the Kingdom of God as Jesus called it, is like. Which aspect do you resonate with the most? Fear? Want to know more about?
2. Do you see the coming kingdom (Day of the Lord, end of the world) as fundamentally good news or bad news? Why?

Read: Psalm 21

WEDNESDAY

1. What stops you from praying “Thy kingdom come” like you mean it? What propels you to pray it?
2. The main message of the Gospels is that in Jesus, the kingdom of God has come. But not yet in totality. What areas of life seem to be under God's control? Not yet in line with his kingdom?

Read: Psalm 22

THURSDAY

1. In what area of your life is it hardest to pray “Thy will be done”? What propels you to pray it?
2. Before Jesus' return, to what degree do you think God's will being done is dependent on you?

Read: Psalm 23

FRIDAY

1. Jesus second coming is all about the kingdom coming in totality. If you knew Jesus was returning tomorrow, what would you do today?

Read: Psalm 24
