Reflection Questions

Psalm 91 is a proclamation of trust and hope in the protection and salvation of God. Yet ironically, the devil uses its very words to tempt Jesus.

Psalm 91

1. List some of the things Ps 91 says God will save his people from. When have you seen this happen? To what degree do you think this happens without us even being aware?
2. When haven't you seen Ps 91 happen? How did it affect you that this seeming promise of God didn't occur? What do you do in those times and how do you come to terms with God?
3. How do you expect God to save, and in what timing?
4. If God doesn't always rescue and protect from every harm, why sing this? Why might you?
5. The devil tempts Jesus with the promises of Psalm 91 (read about it in Matthew 4 or Luke 4). The Psalm (and all the Bible) can be misused. What might be a right use and wrong use of this Psalm? List some ways.

Memorize Psalm 1:1-4

Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers. ² But his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night. ³ He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers. ⁴ **Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.**
