Spring Faith Challenge | Week 35

This spring's faith challenge is to spend a few meditative moments with God twice each weekday, once in the morning and once before bed.

Morning

Pray: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, I start my day in your name. Guide me in your will.

Read & Reflect:

Mon: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble" (Ps 46:1). God is stronger than all things. Today I will recognize that so that I do not run the risk of living in my own strength and missing out on all the great things God can do through me.

Tues: "Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging" (Ps 46:2-3).

I will not fear. I will turn to you in all my troubles and quakes.

Wed: "There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, the holy place where the Most High dwells" (Ps 46:4).

Though my river is at flood-stage, I will step into it in faith, trusting that you can heap the waters up and let me cross on dry ground.

Thur: "God is within her, she will not fall; God will help her at break of day. Nations are in uproar, kingdoms fall; he lifts his voice, the earth melts" (Ps 46:5-6). No matter what's going on in our country and the world, God is on top of it. I will take refuge in that.

Fri: "The LORD Almighty is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress" (Ps 46:7). *A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing.*
